
Introduction to Basic Education and Literacy

The **Rotary India Literacy Mission (RILM)**, formerly known as Rotary South Asia Society for Development and Cooperation (RSAS). The objectives of RILM are Total literacy and Quality Education in India. To achieve that RILM have designed a comprehensive program called "T-E-A-C-H" where:

- T - Teacher Support**
- E - E-learning**
- A - Adult Literacy**
- C - Child Development**
- H - Happy School**

Each of these programs has a specific focus and it is interlinked with each other in achieving the common goal of bringing total literacy and improving the learning outcomes of primary education, in various parts of the country.

Understanding the enormity of the task, we have decided to adopt, in implementing T-E-A-C-H, a strategy of meaningful co-operation with all actors in the field, by forging strong partnerships with the Government, Corporate, National/ State specific Non-Governmental Organizations as well as international organizations working in various segments of this country wide endeavor.

WHAT DOES T-E-A-C-H DO?

- ◆ Training and recognizing **5,000** outstanding teachers in primary schools this year.
- ◆ Establishing **10,000** E-Learning Centers in schools this year.
- ◆ Educating **100,000** adult non-literates across the country this year.
- ◆ Sending **100,000** children back to school this year.
- ◆ Upgrading **1,000** elementary schools to Happy Schools to curtail student dropouts this year.

E-LEARNING



RILM's E-learning Program, "E-Shiksha", aims at improving the teaching-learning experience through the use of curriculum based audio-visual modules in local languages in Govt. / Govt. aided schools.

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"E-Shiksha" is the program in a single classroom installation in Government aided schools which aims to improve the teaching-learning experience through an integrated solution consisting of a LCD projector, LED TV, Smart LED TV loaded with the educational audio-visual software mapped with State curriculum in local languages. Software content can be offline entrenched in a SD card/pen drive or online rooted to any educational application depending upon the requirement of the project.

SOFTWARE:

- Educational contents in line with different State School Board Curriculum/ National curriculum in different India languages.

HARDWARE:

- Android projector/android projector with mini laptop or android stick with Android-box / Laptop
- LED television with Android-box
- Android SMART television

To supply these items a group of respected companies and agencies are selected as partners of RILM. A wide range of software and hardware related options are provided for the interested collaborators / partners, so that they can choose the appropriate of E-learning system according to their specific needs.

BENEFITS:

- Audio-visual representation makes learning more interesting for students, thus ensuring greater attendance in school, increased attentiveness in class, better comprehension
- Positive impact on learning outcomes of the students in terms of improved retention, sharpened capacities for logical thinking, critical visual

thinking, better comprehension, improved language abilities and positive behavioral change.



After CSR is mandatory in India many companies are looking for opportunities where their CSR related work will be visible. Providing E-learning to improve the facilities of school is one of the most visible projects that a company can directly implement / involved via an implementing agency. RILM is doing many such projects with corporates and, one such project is with State Bank of India (SBI) Foundation. Under this project E-learning systems are installed in 3 states, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh and, Maharashtra: on-going.

RILM was also successfully joined hands with several Department of Education of State Governments of India and, signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with them for implementation E-learning program for schools. Total 121,772 E-learning systems to be installed in Government schools, in Gujarat 24,000, Maharashtra 18,510, Madhya Pradesh 15,000, Andhra Pradesh 45,000 and Punjab 19,272 schools.



PP Doc McKenzie, The Rotary Foundation Club Chair read excerpts of RI President Mark Daniel Maloney's "President's message"

In 1988, polio was endemic in 125 countries with more than 350K new cases a year worldwide.

Since then, Rotary and our Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners have reduced the incidence of polio by more than 99.9%, vaccinated more than 2.5 billion children against the virus, and prevented 18M cases of paralysis.


Over the years, Rotary has helped country after country move into the polio-free column. This includes India, which some considered impossible not long ago.



Note: for a country to be considered polio free, they have to go three years without a case being reported. There are three types of polioviruses.

- Type 1 causes paralysis in about 1 in 200 infections;
- Type 2 was last recorded in 1999;
- Type 3 is less virulent than type 1, causing paralysis in about 1 in 1000 cases.

Of the three types of poliovirus, type 2 has been eradicated and type three could soon be certified as eradicated. Type 2 poliovirus was declared eradicated in September 2015, with the last virus detected in India in 1999. Type 3 wild poliovirus has not been detected anywhere in the world since November 2012.




Nigeria has not reported a case of wild poliovirus in nearly three years. If this trend holds, we will be down to just two types of wild poliovirus in only one section of the world, Afghanistan and Pakistan.

People need to be protected against all three types of the virus in order to prevent polio disease and the polio vaccination is the best protection. There are two vaccines used to protect against polio disease, oral polio vaccine and inactivated poliovirus vaccine.

Each year, on October 24, we celebrate **World Polio Day**. This day is a time for all Rotarians from all over the globe to come together, recognize the progress we have made in our fight against polio, and plan the action we must take to end polio forever.



“When we reach our goal, polio will become only the second human disease eradicated on the planet, and rotary will receive international acclaim. Rotary must continue to connect the worked on the effort toward polio eradication. It is up to us. Let us finish the job.”

Also from the October 19 Rotarian Magazine, titled, “The **Plus** in PolioPlus” by Vanessa Glavinskas (Page 30)

- A 2010 study estimates that vitamin A drops given to children at the same time as the polio vaccine have prevented 1.25 million deaths by decreasing susceptibility to infectious diseases.
- Nigeria has been polio free for two+ years. It could soon be declared free of wild poliovirus. There is some concern though, because it is difficult to carry in the northern Nigeria area, where the Boko Haran insurgency has displaced millions of people, leading to malnutrition and spikes in disease.

The Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), of which Rotary is spearheading partner, funds 91% of all immunization staff in the World Health Organization’s Africa region. These staff members are key figures in the fight against polio – and other diseases: 85% give half their time to immunization, surveillance, and outbreak response for other initiatives.

Before we started our board meeting, **PP Rich Courson** gave us a little presentation on **PolioPlus**. Since PP Doc McKenzie stole his thunder, Rich had to alter his presentation.

One of the topics Rich covered was **Rotary Direct**, Rotary's recurring giving program. Rotary Direct Saves:

- Time – Sign up once to give continuous support
- Money – Lower administration costs means more money for programs
- Lives – Give to The Rotary Foundation to do good in the world.
- Two ways to do this:
 - Rotary Direct by credit card Weekly, monthly, quarterly, yearly schedule
 - Weekly, monthly, quarterly, yearly automatic withdrawal from your bank

Rotary Direct allows you do designate where you want your contributions to go to, with 8 options to choose from, from the Annual Fund-SHARE (Club gets credit) to PolioPlus Fund and the Six Areas of Focus funds. The minimum contribution is \$10.00.

It is for the **END POLIO NOW Contest**, which starts on October 1st until the end of November 30th. It is a challenge to all the clubs in D5K. Each club has 60 days to collect money in their PolioPlus Pig. Money collected though the PolioPlus Pig as well as all contributions made by individual members to the Rotary Foundation counts.

By December 13, D5K must have all club reports, **using the 4-Way Test**, of the TOTAL dollar amount your club members donated to PolioPlus during October and November as well as the number of Active Club Members in you club at the end of November 2019.

The winner of this contest will be based on the PER CAPITA DONATIONS of the club.

The winning club will receive a “**Rotarians At Work**” stand up banner for their club to use at work sites or however they choose. Plus, the warm feeling in your hearts knowing how much good you have done for the world.



He felt that HRYF could be the vehicle to teach our young people about the advantages of the free enterprise system, the basis of our democracy.




