Our members combat diseases like malaria, HIV/AIDS, Alzheimer's, multiple sclerosis, diabetes, and polio. Prevention is important, which is why we also focus on health education and bringing people routine hearing, vision, and dental care.

Disease prevention is important. The probability of dying is twice as high for children under age five as for children and youths ages five to 24, which is why Rotary and its partners have been delivering vaccines globally for 40 years, seeking to ensure that all children grow up safe from preventable diseases. - Support health education programs that explain how diseases spread and how to reduce the risk of transmission.
- Partner with medical institutions or ministries of health to immunize people against infectious diseases.

- Improve and expand access to affordable health care in underserved areas.
